Self-Help Groups (SHG)

Eleven (11) Barangays established their own SHG – Barangay Chapters supported by AEPPI ... San Vicente, Landayan, Poblacion, Magsaysay, Bagong Silang, Narra, Laram, Langgam, UBL, Estrella, Nueva.

Four (4) of the 11 barangay chapters received funds from DOLE to start a livelihood project for their members.
